Recipe of the Month

What yummy things are cooking at P.S. 82?

Have you ever had fried chicken before? It tastes really crunchy and good!

The food I chose was Southern fried chicken because I think my mom and brother would like it for dinner. It looks delicious for them. Read to find out how to make fried chicken!

INGREDIENTS

- 1 whole chicken, cut into 10 pieces (2 legs, 2 thighs, 2 wings, 4 breast)
- 4 cups water
- 3 teaspoons salt
- 1 cup buttermilk
- 2 eggs
- 1 tablespoon Season-All salt
- 1 cup flour
- 2 tablespoons cornmeal
- 2 teaspoons dried oregano
- 2 teaspoons Season-All salt
- vegetable oil or shortening

DIRECTIONS

1. Soak chicken in water and salt at least 2 hours in the refrigerator.
2. Mix buttermilk, eggs and Season All and dip chicken pieces in this mixture.
3. Combine 1 cup flour, 2 tbsp corn meal, 2 tsp dried oregano, and 2 tsp Season All in a bag.
4. Drop two pieces of dipped chicken in the bag at one time.
5. Shake to coat.
6. Place on wire rack to rest.
7. Heat a shallow layer of oil or shortening to 360 F in a jumbo chicken skillet.
8. Place the chicken in the pan, trying not to crowd the pieces.
9. Cover for the first five minutes.
10. Check the chicken. When golden brown, turn.
11. Cover for the next five minutes.
12. Remove cover and cook uncovered, turning occasionally, as needed for a total of an additional 20 minutes or until cooked through.
13. Watch carefully, and don't allow it to get too dark!



Fun Science!

Science Experiments You Can Do At Home

You Will Need

- A volcano - Talk to an art teacher about how to make a volcano out of paper maché or plaster. You can also use clay or if you're in a hurry to make your volcano, use a mound of dirt outside.
- A container that 35mm film comes in, and old pill bottle, a baby food jar, or similar size container.
- Red and yellow food coloring (optional)
- Vinegar
- Liquid dish washing soap



What to Do

1. Go outside or prepare for some clean-up inside
2. Put the container into the volcano at the top
3. Add two spoonfuls of baking soda
4. Add about a spoonful of dish soap
5. Add about 5 drops each of the red and yellow food coloring
6. Now for the eruption!: Add about an ounce of the vinegar into the container and watch what your volcano come alive.

A VOLCANO is produced over thousands of years as heat and pressure build up. That aspect of a volcano is very difficult to recreate in a home experiment. However this volcano will give you an idea of what it might look like when a volcano erupts flowing lava. This is a classic experiment in which a CHEMICAL reaction can create the appearance of a PHYSICAL volcano eruption. You should look at pictures of volcanoes to be familiar with the different types. (A SHIELD volcano, for example is the most common kind of volcano, and yet few people know about them) The reaction will bubble up and flow down the side like a real volcano (only much faster!) Look for videos of volcanoes erupting and be sure that you understand how heat and pressure work to really make volcanoes erupt.

Make it an Experiment

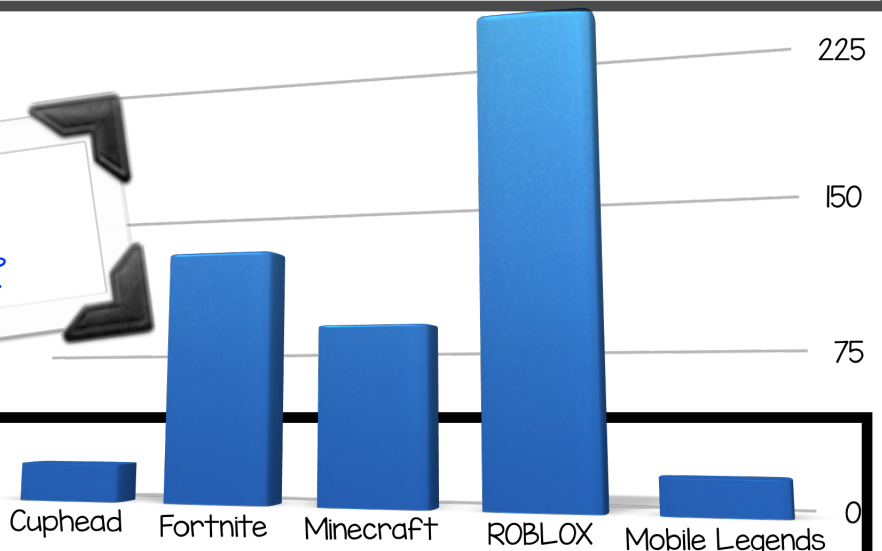
Try to answer these questions:

1. Does vinegar temperature affect how fast the volcano erupts?
2. Does the shape of the volcano affect the direction the eruption travels?
3. What can be added to the "lava" to slow it down and make it more like real lava? 300
4. What combination of vinegar and baking soda creates the biggest eruption?

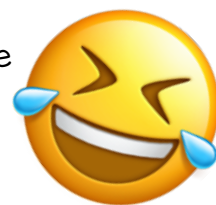
